A New Paradigm for Business Education

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ABSTRACT

Globalization has opened the world and created immense opportunities for knowledge transfer and commerce, creating unique challenges that must be addressed. Social systems are dependent upon a quality-of-life standard that allows for health, freedom, and relative equality in a community.
